LWML is kicking off its annual collection for specialty kits. In the past we have assembled these kits for Lutheran World Relief. However, in 2024 our LWML voted to donate our school kits to an LCMS registered non-profit Christian volunteer network service organization, titled the Orphan Grain Train (OGT). The OGT, whose name is slightly misleading, provides essential aid/relief to victims of disaster or in destitute situations. These kits are distributed nationally and worldwide. There are 27 OGT distribution centers in the United States with the nearest to us being in Pasadena, TX


This year we are collecting monetary donations for **hygiene kits**. (Last year we collected enough to make 40 school kits!) Because items in these kits have very specific requirements regarding sizes and quantities, monetary donations are preferred. This allows the LWML to purchase the correct items and then assemble those items into a completed kit. The approximate cost for the items in one hygiene kit is \$12. This does not include shipping costs.

During May, June and July, the congregation may place monetary donations toward hygiene kits in a labeled box in the narthex. There is a basket displaying items included in the hygiene kit. **Thank you for helping LWML with this extraordinary mission. These kits show our love and support to others in their time of greatest need.**



Households Served – 1416, Total Number in households – 3569, Food Boxes – 1279, Basic Needs – 3392, Home Delivery – 19, Homeless Served – 209, Homeless Visits – 1038, First-time VCAM clients Served – 68

Staple inventory items always in dire need in the pantry:

Rice (1 or 2 lbs. bags – uncooked), cereals (box or bag), 1lb. bag beans, pastas, tomato sauce.

The homeless population served at VCAM also increased. Homeless needs for perishable foods are not always the most cost-effective, so donations in this area to help meet the increased need are greatly appreciated. Donations of small hygiene kits are also encouraged:

Small Canned Meats & other proteins, peanut butter or cheese crackers, breakfast/granola bars, fruit/jello cups.

Summer break starts this month. That usually means an increase in groceries for the home. That usually means an increase in client traffic at VCAM. Our food pantry inventory does not last long. It goes as fast we receive it. We are blessed that we have the means to provide, due to the generosity of others.

To the churches, businesses, organizations & individuals that give: thanks for allowing us to keep our pantry well stocked! Our prayers are that this continues on.

Funds - Each OGT Branch is responsible to raise funds to cover operation and shipment costs. We are staffed with an all-volunteer Board who rely on the Lord to touch the hearts of people. Often asked what we need most..the answer is whatever is on your heart...whether time or treasure.

New Box Trailer - we thank HighPoint Church, Friendswood who funded the purchase of a very spacious box trailer so we can pick up and deliver donations across Texas. God provides!



General Fund - 2025 Income vs Expenses



In the above chart, you can see our expenses and offerings. Our expenses totaled \$23,152.15; our offerings and other income totaled \$23,915.03 resulting in a budgeted "gain" of \$762.88. If you were to go back and look at these numbers for the last 8 months, you would notice the trend that our expenses were greater than offerings and income. In large part, this is due to the incredible increase in our property and liability insurance early in 2024. We share this with you so you are aware of how this is continuing to impact our overall ministry. Even as we continue to thank God for the many blessings He gives to Zion, including those of the financial offerings of His people, the Church Council and Church Office are being as mindful as possible about the stewardship of the church budget.
